### **Birth of NAK;** History of Nephrology and Transplant in Karnataka



The story of Nephrology always begins with story of Dialysis . For the record it should be mentioned that the First Dialysis in India was done at CMC Vellore in 1962 and First successful kidney Transplant was also done in CMC Vellore in 1971

#### Time line of Dialysis in Karnataka;

First Dialysis Machine (Drum Machine) Procured by Mysore State Government in 1962 by Prof TS Jairam Surgeon -Urologist and he was Sent to East Germany for Training. Kasturba Hospital Manipal Dialysis started 1971 and later Bangalore Kidney Foundation –Dialysis started by 1979 Dr NC Talwalkar

In1980, St John's started the dialysis . Later, in 1989 Dr Brian Periera& Lloyd Vincent started CRRT

In 1985 Nephrology unit under Prof Joseph Antony Urologist was started and DrSundar appointed as Lecturer!!





ing many young Paediatric Nephrologists with fellowships and DM program. DrPhadke was also helpful in helping us do Paediatric Transplants in the state.

Late Dr NC Talwalkar considered the father of Karnataka Nephrology was trained in Bombay KEM hospital under India's Pioneer Lady Nephrologist Prof VN Acharya.

Dr Talwalkar came to Bangalore in 1979 to set up the Bangalore Kidney Foundation and with the support of Padma BushanDr MK Mani (who was based in Mumbai at Jaslok Hospital and Dr Mani made Nephrology a household name in India as he was treating LoknayakJayaprakash Narayan ) The Early period from 1979 to 1990 was a path breaking period for Nephrology in Karnataka as there were less than handful of Nephrologists and some of the Nephrologists who helped set up Renal units during that period have moved abroad ( Dr N S Srinivasa, Dr KA Shivakumar, Dr Brian Pereira, Dr KS Ramprasad, DrBalaji, DrRamkumar, DrJaishankar, DrDomnic Raj etc.)The kidney Transplant program was started in 1983 in Bangalore at Lakeside Hospital by Dr Talwalkar and the surgeons who were part of program from Bangalore were DrDilipJavali and DrAjitHuilgol.Later surgeons like DrDilip-Dhanpal, DrDilipPatil came to Bangalore to run transplant program.

In Mysore Dr KC Gurudev after his training in Chennai under Dr MK Mani started the dialysis program and with the help of DrMadappa the Urologist did the first transplant in Karnataka outside Bangalore in Mysore.In 1991 DrSudarshanBallal after his training in prestigious centers in USA returned home to start the Nephrology unit at the Manipal Hospital in Bangalore.Karnataka has organized many Nephrology meetings since 1986 and some are listed below

The story of Karnataka's transplant scene will not be complete without mentioning about the so called Kidney Scam which occurred in 1995.

Doctors and Hospitals in Karnataka and Bangalore in Particular were falsely accused of stealing kidneys by the Police and after 19 long years the High court proclaimed and gave the verdict that the doctors and hospital concerned were innocent and not guilty but this episode damaged the name and hard earned reputation of Karnataka's Nephrologists. Though the incident had its negative effect on the morale of the Nephrologists and the patients it had its positive effect too as the long awaited Human Organ Transplant Act was passed by the Parliament in 1995 and paved the way for Deceased Donor Transplant in India and one can say it was Karnataka's 1995 incident was a serendipity helping the country's Deceased Donor Transplant Program

Karnataka now has a number of Nephrologists in all parts of the state offering state of the art facilities for renal care and many centers outside Bangalore are doing Kidney Transplants. The NAK was founded by a handful of Nephrologists by Late Dr Talwalkar, DrSundar, DrPhadke, DrBalaji( Now in Australia), DrRamprasad, DrSiddaraju, Dr SJ Singh( WgCdrRetd)



In the event of emergencies, people with kidney disease are among the most vulnerable in the population due to their ongoing requirements for consistently coordinated care – care, which is often lifelong and involves complex ongoing treatment. In recent years, the impact of COVID-19 on the health system has placed an added strain on this vulnerable population.

The whole of society, including policymakers, health care services, governments, industry, as well as people living with kidney disease and their carers, must be prepared for unexpected events to avoid any disruption in access to diagnosis, treatment, and care.

The World Kidney Day Joint Steering Committee has declared 2023 to be the year of "Kidney Health for All – Preparing for the unexpected, supporting the vulnerable!". Bengaluru: Nephrology Association of Karnataka (NAK) and State Organ & Tissue Transplant Organization (SOTTO) of Karnataka successfully hosted their joint seminar, "A Gift Like No Other," on March 16, 2023, with Dr. Ishthiaque Ahmed, Convenor-NAK; Dr. Limesh M, Co-Convenor-NAK and Dr. M Kiran Kumar, Member Secretary of SOTTO leading the organizing team.

The seminar which concluded at API Bhavan in Bengaluru emphasized the false myths and superstitions surrounding organ donation while educating about the poor organ donation rate in India as compared to many other countries.

### **KEYNOTE** FROM THE SPEAKERS:



-"Become what you want in life, first become a human. You become human only if you acquire humanism," . "One of the most important acts of humanism is the desire to donate organs. I have seen families who received organs and there is nothing like watching those people. Donating an organ is holier than any other act in the world."

-"One brain dead person can give life to 8 people. It's an amazing gift one can give. Unfortunately in a country of 1.5 billion, the organ donation rate is very low. Most of the recipients are young breadwinners. I would like everyone to spread the message across and may the misbeliefs come to an end."

-" We have a long history of organ donation since our ancient times. We have heard many stories and those stories must be an example that no religion prohibits organ donation. I hope we soon reach a position where all the organ recipients will be blessed with a second life."

Organ donation after brain death is a life-saving possibility for those in need of vital organs such as the heart, lungs, liver, kidneys, pancreas, intestine, cornea, skin, tendons, cartilages, heart valves and bones. When a person is declared brain dead by medical professionals following established guidelines, the organs can be surgically retrieved from cadaveric donors (Braindead) and transplanted to the patients in need.

It's important to understand that brain death is a

permanent and irreversible condition where there is a complete loss of brain function. However, the heart may continue to beat for a short period of time with the help of ventilators and other artificial support systems. During this time, the vital organs can be kept alive and harvested for transplantation.

The seminar witnessed an impressive turnout, with a diverse group of participants from various professions. The event brought together experts and eminent personalities from different fields to share their views and experiences on the subject of organ donation.

During the seminar, the experts addressed the misconceptions surrounding organ donation, highlighting the importance of spreading awareness about this life-saving option. The speakers shared real-life examples and success stories of organ donations, which had a profound impact on the participants.

The seminar was an emotionally stirring experience and the participants drove home the importance of organ donation.

#### Key takeaways of the seminar:

•A single donor can save up to 8 lives and help up to 50 people through organ and tissue donation.

•The process of organ donation after brain death is a safe and effective procedure that can provide a life-saving opportunity for those in need.



•The seminar stressed the importance of spreading awareness about organ donation and debunking the myths and misconceptions surrounding it.

Summary of participant takeaways:

•A patient who received an organ donation shared his emotional journey and how it has given him a new lease on life.

•A patient who is currently on the waiting list for an organ shared his story and how he eagerly awaits the life-changing gift of an organ donation.

•A family who donated their loved one's organs shared their experience and how it was a difficult

but ultimately fulfilling decision.

#### Societal Impact:

•The seminar inspired many participants to spread awareness about the cause.

•The stories shared by the organ recipient, the patient on the waiting list, and the family who donated organs left a profound impact on the attendees.

The success of the seminar is expected to pave the way for more such initiatives in the future









